PRÜFUNGSaufbau

Der Prüfungsaufbau (Goethe-Zertifikat A2):

1. Lesen – 30 Minuten

- Kurze Zeitungsartikel, E-Mails, Anzeigen und Aushänge.
- **Aufgaben:** Multiple Choice (A, B oder C) und Zuordnen.

2. Hören – ca. 30 Minuten

- Alltagsgespräche, Ansagen im Radio oder Telefonnachrichten.
- **Aufgaben:** Multiple Choice und Informationen zuordnen.

3. Schreiben – 30 Minuten

- Sms, E-Mails oder kurze Mitteilungen über deinen Alltag schreiben.

4. Sprechen – ca. 15 Minuten (Paarprüfung)

- Teil 1: Fragen zur Person stellen und antworten.
- Teil 2: Von sich selbst erzählen (z.B. über Hobbys oder Arbeit).
- Teil 3: Etwas gemeinsam planen oder aushandeln.
- **Goethe-Institut +4**

Gesamt: ca. 1 Stunde 45 Minuten (inklusive Pausen)

Exam Structure

- Duration: 30 minutes
- Parts: 4 sections
- Total Tasks: 20 questions

Part	Task Type	Focus
Teil 1	Multiple Choice (A, B oder C)	Einen Informationstext lesen (z. B. Zeitungsartikel oder Blog) und Hauptpunkte verstehen.
Teil 2	Zuordnung (Informationen finden)	Informationen in einem Text verstehen (z. B. eine Hausordnung oder ein Programm).
Teil 3	Multiple Choice (A, B oder C)	Eine E-Mail oder einen persönlichen Brief verstehen.
Teil 4	Zuordnung (Anzeigen)	Kurze Anzeigen lesen und entscheiden, welche Anzeige zu welcher Person passt.

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Was wird im Teil „Lesen“ getestet?

In der A2-Prüfung wird geprüft, ob du **alltägliche Texte** verstehen kannst. Es geht darum:

- Die **Kernbotschaft** eines Textes zu erfassen.
- **Gezielte Informationen** (Termine, Orte, Regeln) schnell zu finden.
- **Absichten** in persönlichen Nachrichten (Wünsche, Einladungen, Absagen) zu erkennen.



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LESEN TIPS

1. Skim for the "Global" Idea (Teil 1)

- Context: In A2 Part 1, you often read a short article. Before looking for details, ask: What happened? Who is it about?
- The Trap: Don't just match one word from the question to the text. The exam often uses different words to describe the same event.

2. Precise Scanning for "Matching" (Teil 2 & 3)

- Bulletin Boards/Ads: You often have to match a person's need to a specific advertisement.
- Strict Criteria: If the task says "Person A wants to learn music on weekends," an ad for a music school that only opens Mon-Fri is a "distractor." Both must match.

3. Identify Grammar "Logic" Clues

- Negatives & Modals: Watch for "nicht", "kein", or modal verbs like "dürfen" (permission) vs. "müssen" (obligation).
- Example: „Man darf hier parken“ (Allowed) vs. „Man muss hier parken“ (Mandatory).

4. Paraphrasing is Key

- A2 questions almost always use synonyms instead of the exact words from the text.
 - Text: „Der Eintritt ist kostenlos.“
 - Question: „Man muss nichts bezahlen.“

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LESEN TIPS

Study Tips

- Read "Real-World" German: Use websites like DW Learn German or Alumniportal Deutschland for A2-level news and cultural texts.
- Vocabulary Groups: Focus on topics like Travel, Work, and Health.
- Time Management: Aim for 30 minutes for the entire reading section (4 parts). Practice finishing one part in 7–8 minutes.
- Identify Compound Nouns: Practice breaking down long words (e.g., Haustürschlüssel = Haus + Tür + Schlüssel) to understand meaning faster.

Keyword & Context Practice

- W-Questions for Logic:
 - Wohin? → Direction/Destination
 - Wie lange? → Duration (not just a point in time)
 - Seit wann? → Starting point in the past
- Identify the Text Type: Quickly decide if you are reading an Anzeige (Ad), a Mitteilung (Notice), or a Bericht (Report) to know where the important info usually sits.

Exam Structure

- Duration: 30 minutes
- Parts: 4 sections
- Total Tasks: 20 questions

Part		Task Type	Focus
Teil 1	Multiple Choice (A, B, C)	5 short audios, played twice	Specific Information: Understanding daily notices, weather reports, or news snippets.
Teil 2	Information Matching	1 long dialogue, played once	Daily Activities: Matching people to specific actions, days of the week, or preferences (e.g., who is doing what at a party).
Teil 3	Multiple Choice (A, B, C)	5 short dialogues, played once	Conversational Context: Identifying specific details like times, prices, or meeting places from casual exchanges.
Teil 4	True/False (Richtig/Falsch)	1 interview/dialogue, played twice	Gist & Detail: Understanding an interview or longer discussion about personal opinions or experiences.

Key Exam Rules

- **Reading Time:** You are given time to read the questions **before** each audio starts.
- **Transferring Answers:** At the end of the 30 minutes, you must write your final answers on the **Antwortbogen** (answer sheet).



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HÖREN TIPS

1. Use the pause effectively

- **Read first:** You always have time to read the tasks before the audio starts.
- **Predict:** Look at the pictures or options. If you see a train station, expect words like *Gleis*, *Verspätung*, or *Abfahrt*.
- **Example:** If the question is "Where are they meeting?", look for place prepositions (*vor*, *im*, *am*).

2. Listen for "Signal Words"

- **The Switch:** Watch out for words like "**aber**" or "**leider**". They often change the answer.
 - *Speaker:* "I wanted to go at 2:00, **but** now I'm coming at 4:00." (The answer is 4:00).
- **Correction:** Sometimes speakers correct themselves: "Let's meet on Tuesday- oh wait, I mean Wednesday."

3. Watch out for Synonyms (Paraphrasing)

- The audio will rarely use the exact word from the question.
 - Question: "*Das Essen ist teuer.*"
 - Audio: "*Das Menü kostet viel Geld.*"
- **Practice pairs:** *schlecht* = *nicht so gut*; *müde* = *keine Energie*.

4. Don't get stuck

- If you miss a word, **keep going**.
- In Part 1 and 2, you hear the audio **twice**. Use the first time to get the main idea and the second to confirm the detail.

Study Tips

- **Listen to "Nicos Weg" (A2):** Focus on everyday dialogues about work, doctor visits, and shopping.
- **Podcast "Deutsch-Trainer":** Great for hearing A2 vocabulary in short, clear sentences.
- **Practice with Noise:** Try listening to a sample test with the TV or a fan on low volume to simulate a real exam room.
- **Dictation:** Listen to a short German sentence, pause it, and try to write it down exactly.

Keyword & Audio Comprehension Practice

- **Filter the "Noise":** In A2, there is often "distractor" information.
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 - *Question:* "How much is the bread?"
 - *Audio:* "The cake is 3€, the coffee is 2€, and the **bread is 1.50€.**"
- **Identify the Speaker:**
 - *Anrufbeantworter* (Answering machine) → Usually names, dates, phone numbers.
 - *Durchsage* (Announcement) → Usually platform numbers, delays, or weather warnings.
